Courses choice

Exchange students can follow both undergraduate and postgraduate course.

<u>Please note</u>: For 2024/2025, here are the exceptions which, unless modified, will be maintained in 2025/2026. Due to a lack of availability:

- The Korean studies department is closed. It is not possible to enroll in any of the classes from this department.
- In the Japanese studies department's Bachelor degree:
 - o 1st year courses are closed to all students.
 - 2nd year courses are available to students who can provide a JLPT N3 (120/180 minimum).
 - 3rd year courses are available to students who can provide a JLPT N2.
 - As a rule, students whose mother-tongue is Japanese can take courses from the department (excepted for the courses from de 1st year of Bachelor degree) but their admission remains subject to availability.
- 1st year courses from the Russian, Chinese and Arabic studies departments are not accessible to full beginners since they require to have previously studied the language for at least 200 hours.
- The few **English courses** taught at Inalco are unfortunately overcrowded and therefore closed to exchange students.

French as a Foreign Language (FLE) courses

Language prerequisites

All proficiency levels are available from A1 (full beginner) to C1 (advanced).

Please note that a French language test will be sent to incoming students before their arrival at Inalco. Its results will determine the group level to which the student will be registered at Inalco, regardless of other results from DELF/DALF exams.

Students enrolled for the academic year will be expected to remain within the same group throughout the year. For example, it will not be possible to take B1 level courses in the first semester and B2 level courses in the second semester.

Thematic and Disciplinary courses

Exchange students have the opportunity to enrol in courses that focus on examining phenomena through a transnational perspective, offering an opening onto one or more of the following disciplines and themes:

- Anthropology
- World art
- Global political issues
- The environment
- Gender and sexuality in the world
- Connected world history
- Linguistics
- Literature, arts and translation
- Orality
- Philosophies from elsewhere
- Religion
- Violence, migration, memory

Language requirements

Level: French **B1** minimum, **B2** recommended (DELF/DALF - TCF - Certificate from home university).

Please note:

Access to Inalco's thematic and disciplinary courses is subject to final approval by the teachers. Students must therefore obtain confirmation of their admission from the teachers during the first week of the course.

<u>Professional Track courses</u> (Undergraduate-level courses only)

Students wishing to enroll in a Professional Track course have to submit additional documents during their online application. Admission results to said courses will be sent separately from the admission to the International Student Exchange Programme.

Accepted students will be able to register for courses in the Professional Track to which they have been admitted, according to the terms and conditions specified when their admission is finalized. Please note that the choice of courses must be discussed with the pedagogical team of the Professional Track in question and the exchange program coordinator.

Professional Track courses are not open to students who did not specifically apply for them.

Please note:

Professional track courses are only available to students enrolling for the entire 2023-2024 academic year (September to June); therefore, they are not available to students coming for the Spring semester.

Students admitted to the Intercultural Communication and Training program will receive a list of courses from which to choose. This list will be drawn up according to the student's profile and previous studies.

Students with a B2 level in English will also be able to register for courses taught in English.




The course catalogue can be found on the Inalco website by following the instructions below:
